In addition, members of our Labor & Employment Law group will discuss when injunctions are necessary when dealing with employment issues such as non-compete agreements and proprietary information.

Special guest speakers for the CLE program will include **Mark G. Weitzman**, Disciplinary Counsel, and **Samuel F. Napoli**, Disciplinary Counsel, for The Disciplinary Board of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, District IV. They will address Rule 402 of the Rules of Disciplinary Enforcement (Access to Disciplinary Information and Confidentiality); and Rule 1.5 of the Rules of Professional Conduct (Fees). They will review the rules which govern billing and fee collection, best practices for collecting past-due fees while satisfying legal ethics standards, and options for resolving billing disputes.
